3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

Mandatory competencies:

Planning and organising the counsellor's work

- Creating condition that correspond to the service criteria
- Doing information work
- Preparing documentation
- Registration of consultations

Counselling of debtors

- Beginning of counselling, agreeing on terms of cooperation with a client/counterparties
- Clarifying and defining the problems
- Examining documents, collecting information, checking debt-claims
- Explaining one's rights and liabilities to the client
- Analysing the debt case, preparing a network map
- Formulating targets, planning of activities (incl. intervention) and a schedule
- Processing the application and other documents
- Supporting and motivating the client
- Assessing, adapting/changing the activities
- Terminating or coming to an end of counselling, assessment of the result

Conducting negotiations between the client and the creditor(s)

- Mapping a starting position
- Finding possible solutions
- Helping the client in the process of coming to an agreement

Reflexion and professional self-development

- Analysing and evaluating one's work
- Participating in collegial counselling (co-vision)
- Participating in super-vision
- Professional individual development
- Elaborating the debt counselling service
- Elaborating the content and methodology of the service
- Elaborating the service organisation
- Performing the preventive and information work with the client and the wider society
- Introducing debt counselling service and doing information work
- Teaching the fundamentals of family economics to different target groups
- Raising the population's financial literacy

- Managing the work of debt counsellors in an organisation, entity, counselling centre, etc.
- Preparing and/or managing projects

- Training debt counsellors

Counselling in the process of debt restructuring

- Helping the client during the negotiations with creditors
- Helping the client to prepare an application for debt restructuring
- Motivating and supporting the client during the implementation of debt restructuring plan

Being a trustee in decommitment procedure

- Guiding and checking the debtor at performing debt obligations
